

<u>Report of Council Chair</u>: Fellowship meal went well. Still planning to appoint at least two additional council members. Community pantry is complete, and now to install it. Request from Don Palmquist to transfer membership to Zion Wooster. Sharon mo., Barb 2nd, carried with sadness.
