Tim's Time - Lay Leader Thoughts

Hebrew Phrase: ZEH YADATI KI ELOHIM LI

I don't speak Hebrew, but I have a friend that does. He told me this phrase because somehow he knew that I was going through a rough spell. I was struggling. I was worrying. I was hurting. I was angry. I was upset about how I was treated. I was dwelling on the past. I was concerned about the future. It isn't every day that one finds something that can help in many situations, but this one moment in time proved me wrong here. This one phrase did make a difference—even before I fully understood the meaning that it holds. I hope that when reading this phrase in the Hebrew language that you get the same sense of comfort. I hope that you get the same sense of peace that washed over me when he spoke these words. I provided my own pronunciation in parenthesis, it was the closest I could get to speaking these words as they were intended to spoken.

Say them with me. ZEH YADATI KI ELOHIM LI (zay yah-DAH-ti KEY el-lo-HIM ley)

"This I know: That God is on my side."

Say it with me again: "This I know: That God is on my side."

This phase comes from the book of Psalms chapter 56. As I continue to read the Psalms daily in an effort to read the entire book each month, over and over again, this is one of the phrases that keeps sticking in my mind. The chapter is full of so many troubles: Hounded by people, slanderous words being spoken, physical attacks. Enemies plotting at every turn. Hopelessness, fear, and sadness consumes.

But David calls on the Lord in his troubles. When he is afraid, he puts his trust in the Lord. He calls on the Lord, and he knows that his foes will retreat. Why? Because he knows that with God by our side, there is nothing that can overcome us. We will always be victorious, because of his presence in our lives. Who can be against God and prevail? No one can. God prevails. God overcomes. God rescues. Be assured by this that nothing can overcome the love of God in our lives.

<u>Pastoral Report</u>: Tim conducted all services in May (07, 14, 21, 28). Reviewed hymn selections for June & July, selected hymns for August with the help of Music and Worship committee (Kathy & Amanda). Below are guidelines and a supply list to assist you with your purchases. Please drop your kits off at the church. The office is open Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday mornings until Noon; you may also leave the kits in the Narthex on Sunday mornings. For further information, contact Beth Ann Zimmerman at 330-749-7662. Thank you in advance for your assistance and generosity.

GUIDELINES:

- If you are looking to purchase backpacks, the preferred style is often used in the U.S. for youth to carry athletic equipment. Try your local sporting goods store or search online using the keywords, "buy drawstring backpacks."
- Before purchasing backpacks, make sure they meet the size requirements (14" x 17") and General Assembly Instructions. You can download a list from our website of suppliers who have appropriate bags available for purchase in bulk.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT:

FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10½";
no loose leaf paper
ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
ONE pencil sharpener
ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons ONE 2 ½" eraser
ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder
straps (no standard backpacks)

In addition to School Kits, LWR gladly accepts Personal Care (Health) Kits, Baby Care Kits, Fabric Kits and Quilts.
